Simple Phone Case Knitting Pattern by No Idle Han



A quick project knitted in the round on ordinary needles.

Skill level: average

Sizing: one size fits most smart phones (approx. 14cm circumference) You will need

- 4 ply non-hairy yarn (I used Rowan fine tweed)
- a pair of 2 34 mm needles
- a spare needle

Cast on 24 sts

Row 1: (K1, yfwd, sl 1, yb), repeat to end of row. Row 2 and subsequent rows: Repeat row 1, knitting the stitches slipped in previous row and slipping those knitted previously. Continue until case measures approx. 2cm under the total required length.

Rib: (k1, yfwd, sl1, p1, sl1, yb), repeat to end of row. Repeat until case measures length of phone. Abbreviations k - knit p - purl sl - slip stitch (purlwise throughout pattern) sn - spare needle yb - yarn back yfwd - yarn forward

Cast Off: holding the spare needle at the back and casting off stitches from the right hand needle at the front, cast off as follows -

K1. sl1 onto sn, p1, use the left hand needle to lift the first stitch over the second and drop it off the needle to cast off 1, sl1 onto sn, * k1, cast off 1, sl1 onto sn, p1, cast off 1, sl1 onto sn. Repeat from * until all front row stitches have been used up, then turn and cast off those remaining on sn.

Cut yarn and pull through last stitch. Sew in ends and admire your handiwork!
